## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9	Amending the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39), entitled "An act licensing and regulating the practice of social work; providing penalties; and making an appropriation," further providing for definitions, FOR QUALIFICATIONS FOR LICENSE, < for reciprocity, for restriction on the use of title "licensed clinical social worker," FOR RESTRICTIONS ON THE < USE OF TITLE "LICENSED PROFESSIONAL COUNSELOR," for penalties and for unlawful practice; and repealing provisions related to appropriation.
10	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
11	hereby enacts as follows:
12	Section 1. Sections 3, <del>10 and 16.1</del> 7(E)(3)(I) AND (F)(3)(I), <
13	10, 16.1 AND 16.3 of the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39),
14	known as the Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and
15	Professional Counselors Act, are amended to read:
16	Section 3. Definitions.
17	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
18	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
19	context clearly indicates otherwise:
20	"Application of social work methods and theory." Includes

1 psychosocial assessment, crisis intervention, case management, 2 client-centered advocacy, psychotherapy and family therapy with 3 individuals, couples, families and groups in an effort to 4 prevent or ameliorate family and personal dysfunction at home, 5 at work and in the community. 6 "Board." The State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and

7 Family Therapists and Professional Counselors under the Bureau
8 of Professional and Occupational Affairs within the Department
9 of State.

10 "Client." A person with whom a licensee has established a
11 formal provider-client relationship and to whom the licensee is
12 providing, or has provided, professional services.

13"CLINICAL SOCIAL WORK ASSESSMENT." A PROCESS OF EVALUATION<--</th>14IN WHICH A CLINICAL SOCIAL WORKER CONDUCTS A DIFFERENTIAL,

15 INDIVIDUALIZED AND ACCURATE IDENTIFICATION OF THE PSYCHOSOCIAL

16 AND BEHAVIORAL PROBLEMS EXISTING IN THE LIFE OF AN INDIVIDUAL

17 CLIENT, FAMILY OR GROUP FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING A PLAN

18 TO IMPLEMENT A COURSE OF PSYCHOTHERAPEUTIC COUNSELING. THE TERM

19 INCLUDES, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO, A MENTAL HEALTH EXAMINATION AND

20 <u>PSYCHOLOGICAL HISTORY.</u>

21 "Commissioner." The Commissioner of Professional and

22 Occupational Affairs.

23 <u>"Diagnosis." The term includes the following:</u>

24 <u>(1) A clinical social work assessment, defined as the</u> <--

25 <u>process of evaluation in which a clinical social worker</u>

26 <u>conducts a differential, individualized and accurate</u>

27 <u>identification of the psychosocial/behavioral problems</u>

28 <u>existing in the life of the individual client</u>, the family or

29 group for the purpose of establishing a plan to implement a

30 <u>course of psychotherapeutic counseling. A clinical social</u>

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1	work assessment includes, but is not limited to, a mental_
2	status examination and a psychosocial history. A MARRIAGE AND <
3	FAMILY THERAPIST ASSESSMENT OR A PROFESSIONAL COUNSELOR
4	ASSESSMENT.
5	(2) The utilization by a clinical social worker of <
6	currently accepted diagnostic classifications BY A CLINICAL <
7	SOCIAL WORKER, A MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPIST OR A
8	PROFESSIONAL COUNSELOR, including, but not limited to, the
9	American Psychiatric Association's Diagnostic and Statistical
10	Manual of Mental Disorders, as amended and supplemented, but
11	only to the extent of the clinical social worker's, MARRIAGE <
12	AND FAMILY THERAPIST'S OR PROFESSIONAL COUNSELOR'S education,
13	training, experience and scope of practice as established by
14	this act.
15	"Independent practice of clinical social work." The
16	application of clinical social work knowledge and skills by an
17	individual:
18	(1) who regulates and is responsible for his or her own
19	practice and treatment procedures; and
20	(2) whose practice is not affiliated with any other
21	practice, health care facility, government agency or
22	government-regulated social service agency.
23	"INDEPENDENT PRACTICE OF MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPY." THE <
24	APPLICATION OF MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPY KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS
25	BY AN INDIVIDUAL:
26	(1) WHO REGULATES AND IS RESPONSIBLE FOR HIS OR HER OWN
27	PRACTICE AND TREATMENT PROCEDURES; AND
28	(2) WHOSE PRACTICE IS NOT AFFILIATED WITH ANY OTHER
29	PRACTICE, HEALTH CARE FACILITY, GOVERNMENT AGENCY OR
30	GOVERNMENT-REGULATED SOCIAL SERVICE AGENCY.

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1 "INDEPENDENT PRACTICE OF PROFESSIONAL COUNSELING." THE APPLICATION OF PROFESSIONAL COUNSELING KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS BY 2 3 AN INDIVIDUAL: (1) WHO REGULATES AND IS RESPONSIBLE FOR HIS OR HER OWN 4 5 PRACTICE AND TREATMENT PROCEDURES; AND (2) WHOSE PRACTICE IS NOT AFFILIATED WITH ANY OTHER 6 PRACTICE, HEALTH CARE FACILITY, GOVERNMENT AGENCY OR 7 8 GOVERNMENT-REGULATED SOCIAL SERVICE AGENCY. 9 "Licensed bachelor social worker." A social worker who holds 10 a current bachelor's level license under this act. 11 "Licensed clinical social worker." [A social worker] An 12 individual who engages in or advertises to engage in the 13 practice of clinical social work and who holds a current 14 clinical license under this act. "Licensed marriage and family therapist." An individual who 15 16 engages in or offers to engage in the practice of marriage and family therapy and who holds a current license under this act. 17 18 "Licensed professional counselor." An individual who engages 19 in OR ADVERTISES TO ENGAGE IN the practice of professional <---20 counseling and who holds a current license under this act. 21 "Licensed social worker." [A social worker] An individual who engages in or advertises to engage in the practice of social 22 23 work and who holds a current license under this act. 24 "MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPIST ASSESSMENT." THE PROFESSIONAL <--APPLICATION OF PSYCHOTHERAPEUTIC AND FAMILY SYSTEMS THEORIES AND 25 26 TECHNIQUES TO EVALUATE AND IDENTIFY PSYCHOSOCIAL AND BEHAVIORAL PROBLEMS IN THE CONTEXT OF SIGNIFICANT INTERPERSONAL 27 RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN INDIVIDUALS, COUPLES, FAMILIES AND GROUPS 28 FOR THE PURPOSE OF TREATMENT. THE TERM INCLUDES, BUT IS NOT 29 LIMITED TO, A MENTAL HEALTH EXAMINATION AND PSYCHOLOGICAL 30

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1 <u>HISTORY.</u>

"Practice of bachelor social work." The professional 2 3 application of social work theory, knowledge, methods, principles, values and ethics to restore or enhance social or 4 psychosocial functioning of individuals, couples, families, 5 6 groups, organizations and communities. This practice is basic 7 generalist nonclinical practice that includes interviewing, 8 planning, intervention, case management, mediation, supportive counseling, information and referral, problem solving, client 9 10 education, advocacy, community organization and the development, 11 implementation and administration of policies, programs and 12 activities.

13 "Practice of clinical social work." Holding oneself out to 14 the public by any title or description of services incorporating the term "licensed clinical social worker" or using any words or 15 16 symbols indicating or tending to indicate that one is a licensed 17 clinical social worker and under such description offering to 18 render or rendering a service in which a special knowledge of 19 social resources, human personality and capabilities and 20 therapeutic techniques is directed at helping people to achieve 21 adequate and productive personal, interpersonal and social adjustments in their individual lives, in their families and in 22 23 their community. The term includes person and environment 24 perspectives, systems theory and cognitive/behavioral theory, to 25 the assessment, diagnosis and treatment of psychosocial 26 disability and impairment, including mental and emotional disorders, developmental disabilities and substance abuse. The 27 28 term includes the application of social work methods and theory. 29 The term includes the practice of social work plus additional concentrated training and study as defined by the board by 30

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1 regulation.

"Practice of marriage and family therapy." The professional 2 3 application of psychotherapeutic and family systems theories and techniques to the evaluation, assessment, <u>DIAGNOSIS</u> and 4 <--treatment of mental and emotional disorders, whether cognitive, 5 affective or behavioral. The term includes the evaluation and 6 assessment of mental and emotional disorders in the context of 7 8 significant interpersonal relationships and the delivery of psychotherapeutic services to individuals, couples, families and 9 10 groups for the purpose of treating such disorders.

"Practice of professional counseling." Includes, to the extent compatible with a practitioner's education and professional competence, all of the following:

14 (1) The application of principles and practices of
15 counseling, mental health and human development to evaluate
16 and facilitate human growth and adjustment throughout the
17 life span and to prevent and treat mental, emotional or
18 behavioral disorders and associated stresses which interfere
19 with mental health and normal human growth and development.

20 The evaluation [and assessment], ASSESSMENT, (2)21 DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT of normal and abnormal mental, 22 emotional, social, educational, vocational, family and 23 behavioral functioning throughout the life span; individual, 24 group, family counseling and psychotherapy; crisis 25 intervention, career counseling and educational and 26 vocational counseling; functional assessment of persons with 27 disabilities; and professional consulting.

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(3) Professional counselors' utilization of verbal and
 nonverbal approaches and specialization in the use of arts based therapeutic approaches, such as art, dance, music or

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1 drama, to accomplish treatment objectives.

2 "Practice of social work." Offering to render or rendering a 3 service in which a special knowledge of social resources, human personality and capabilities and therapeutic techniques is 4 5 directed at helping people to achieve adequate and productive personal, interpersonal and social adjustments in their 6 7 individual lives, in their families and in their community or 8 holding oneself out to the public by any title or description of 9 services incorporating the term "social worker" or using any 10 words or symbols indicating or tending to indicate that one is a social worker, except as otherwise provided by this act. 11

19 "Social worker." A person who holds a current license under 20 this act or has received a bachelor's, master's or doctoral 21 degree from an accredited school or program of social work or 22 social welfare.

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23 SECTION 7. QUALIFICATIONS FOR LICENSE.

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(E) MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPIST LICENSE.--AN APPLICANT
SHALL BE QUALIFIED TO HOLD ONESELF OUT AS A LICENSED MARRIAGE
AND FAMILY THERAPIST IF THE APPLICANT SUBMITS PROOF SATISFACTORY
TO THE BOARD THAT ALL OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY:

30 (3) THE APPLICANT HAS COMPLIED WITH THE EXPERIENCE 20170SB0530PN1166 - 7 - 1 REQUIREMENT AS FOLLOWS:

(I) AN INDIVIDUAL MEETING THE EDUCATIONAL
REQUIREMENTS OF PARAGRAPH (2) (I) OR (II) MUST HAVE
COMPLETED AT LEAST 3,000 HOURS OF SUPERVISED CLINICAL
EXPERIENCE, ACCEPTABLE TO THE BOARD AS DETERMINED BY

10 (F) PROFESSIONAL COUNSELORS LICENSE. -- AN APPLICANT IS 11 QUALIFIED FOR A LICENSE TO HOLD ONESELF OUT AS A LICENSED 12 PROFESSIONAL COUNSELOR IF THE APPLICANT SUBMITS PROOF 13 SATISFACTORY TO THE BOARD THAT ALL OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY: 14 \* \* \*

15 (3) THE APPLICANT HAS COMPLIED WITH THE EXPERIENCE16 REQUIREMENTS AS FOLLOWS:

(I) AN INDIVIDUAL MEETING THE EDUCATIONAL
REQUIREMENTS OF PARAGRAPH (2) (I) OR (II) MUST HAVE
COMPLETED AT LEAST 3,000 HOURS OF SUPERVISED CLINICAL
EXPERIENCE, ACCEPTABLE TO THE BOARD AS DETERMINED BY

25 Section 10. Reciprocity.

26 (a) General rule.--The board shall have the power to grant a 27 reciprocal license to an applicant who is licensed or certified 28 as a bachelor social worker, social worker, clinical social 29 worker, marriage and family therapist or professional counselor 30 in another state and has demonstrated qualifications which equal

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or exceed those required pursuant to this act in the 1 2 determination of the board, provided that no license shall be 3 granted under this section to an applicant unless the state in which the applicant is licensed affords reciprocal treatment to 4 persons who are residents of this Commonwealth and who are 5 licensed pursuant to this act. 6 7 (b) Emergencies. -- The board shall have the power to allow an 8 individual who is licensed or certified as a clinical social worker, A MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPIST OR A PROFESSIONAL 9 COUNSELOR in another state to practice in this Commonwealth 10 without licensure for no more than 60 days as part of a relief 11 12 effort related to a state of emergency as declared by the 13 Federal Government or the Governor.

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14 Section 16.1. Restriction on the use of title "Licensed 15 Clinical Social Worker."

16 Only individuals who have received licenses as licensed clinical social workers under this act may style themselves as 17 18 licensed clinical social workers and use the letters "L.C.S.W." 19 in connection with their names. It shall be unlawful for an individual to style oneself as a licensed clinical social 20 worker, advertise or engage in the independent practice of 21 clinical social work or use any words or symbols indicating or 22 23 tending to indicate that the individual is a licensed clinical 24 social worker without holding a license in good standing under this act. 25

26 SECTION 16.3. RESTRICTION ON THE USE OF TITLE "LICENSED
27 PROFESSIONAL COUNSELOR."

ONLY INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE RECEIVED LICENSES AS LICENSED
PROFESSIONAL COUNSELORS UNDER THIS ACT MAY STYLE THEMSELVES AS
LICENSED PROFESSIONAL COUNSELORS AND USE THE LETTERS "L.P.C." IN

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CONNECTION WITH THEIR NAMES. IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL FOR AN
 INDIVIDUAL TO STYLE ONESELF AS A LICENSED PROFESSIONAL
 COUNSELOR, ADVERTISE OR ENGAGE IN THE INDEPENDENT PRACTICE OF
 PROFESSIONAL COUNSELING OR USE ANY WORDS OR SYMBOLS INDICATING
 OR TENDING TO INDICATE THAT THE INDIVIDUAL IS A LICENSED
 PROFESSIONAL COUNSELOR WITHOUT HOLDING A LICENSE IN GOOD
 STANDING UNDER THIS ACT.

10 Section 17. Penalties.

12 (b) Civil penalty.--In addition to any other civil remedy or 13 criminal penalty provided for in this act, the board, by a vote 14 of the majority of the maximum number of the authorized 15 membership of the board as provided by law, or by a vote of the majority of the duly qualified and confirmed membership or a 16 17 minimum of three members, whichever is greater, may levy a civil 18 penalty of up to \$10,000 on any current licensee who violates 19 any provision of this act, on any person who engages in the 20 independent practice of clinical social work, THE INDEPENDENT <---21 PRACTICE OF MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPY OR THE INDEPENDENT 22 PRACTICE OF PROFESSIONAL COUNSELING without being licensed 23 pursuant to this act or on any person who holds himself or 24 herself out as a licensed bachelor social worker, licensed 25 social worker, licensed clinical social worker, licensed 26 marriage and family therapist, licensed professional counselor 27 or marriage and family therapist without being so licensed pursuant to this act. The board shall levy this penalty only 28 29 after affording the accused party the opportunity for a hearing, 30 as provided in Title 2 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes

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1 (relating to administrative law and procedure).

3 Section 3. Section 20(a) of the act is amended to read:4 Section 20. Unlawful practice.

5 (a) Unlawful practice prohibited.--It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the independent practice of clinical 6 social work, THE INDEPENDENT PRACTICE OF MARRIAGE AND FAMILY\_ 7 <---8 THERAPY OR THE INDEPENDENT PRACTICE OF PROFESSIONAL COUNSELING or hold himself or herself out as a licensed bachelor social 9 10 worker, licensed social worker, licensed clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist and professional counselor without 11 12 possessing a valid, unexpired, unrevoked and unsuspended license 13 issued under this act.

15 Section 4. Section 21 of the act is repealed: 16 [Section 21. Appropriation.

17 The sum of \$85,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Professional Licensure 18 19 Augmentation Account within the General Fund to the Bureau of 20 Professional and Occupational Affairs in the Department of State 21 for the payment of costs of processing licenses and renewals, for the operation of the board and for other general costs of 22 23 the bureau operations relating to this act. The appropriation 24 granted shall be repaid by the board within three years of the 25 beginning of issuance of licenses by the board.] 26 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 120 days.

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
